Submission Open: September 12 - October 17, 2025

## **Rules for Submission**

The International Neuropsychological Society recognizes that late breaking research (data collected or analyzed after the official abstract deadline) should be made available for presentation at the Annual Meeting. Specific criteria have been developed for late breaking abstract submissions.

- All accepted late breaking abstracts will be presented as posters on the last day of the meeting, at a designated late breaking poster session on Saturday, February 7, 2026 (time to be announced). By submitting, authors commit to be available to present in person at this session.
- The research must be novel, innovative, contemporary, and of high scientific significance to deserve special consideration after the original abstract deadline. Abstracts should describe research that could not be completed prior to the original deadline.
- All research, results, and conclusions must be final at the time of submission. Submissions that are promissory in nature will not be considered.
- Late breaking abstracts must not be a revision of an abstract submitted prior to the original submission deadline.
- Late breaking abstracts must not have been presented, accepted for presentation, or published at any other scientific meeting or journal at the time of submission.

## **General Guidelines**

- There is no limitation on the number of submissions, but authors are asked to use discretion because submitting multiple abstracts is likely to create scheduling problems.
- The body of submitted abstracts may not exceed 500 words. Submissions must be organized under the following four headings: Objective, Participants and Methods, Results, and Conclusions.
- Late breaking abstract submissions must be submitted through the online submission platform at the link below.
- Late breaking submissions are due by no later than 11:59pm U.S. Eastern Time on Friday October 17, 2025. Authors will be notified of acceptance or rejection by November 21.
- Presenters must pay the Annual Meeting registration fee and all other costs associated with travel to present at the Annual Meeting.
- Submissions will be published exactly as received. Please proofread carefully before finalizing your submission. Once the deadline has passed, we reserve the right to decline to accommodate any requests for corrections to typos or other entry errors made by the author.
